



New Signs Detail Mound History

Some news signs will be dotting the landscape along the Midland Trail.

SOUTH CHARLESTON -- The Midland Trail Scenic Highway Association unveiled a new wayside exhibit next to the mound in South Charleston Wednesday. The five panel exhibit features interpretive signs that explain the mound and the people who built it.

This installment, highlighting the Adena people who lived in the area around 500 B.C. is the first in a series of exhibits that will share the history of the Midland Trail with travelers.

The signs are meant to highlight the people and history of US Route 60.

Twenty five more panels will be installed at other sites and will be included in an illustrated history of the Midland Trail.

The association is seeking artist's submissions for the illustrations on the panels. The deadline for the next round of submissions is August 31, 2010.
